Authors are requested to include a declaration that their paper has not been submitted to any other conference or journal and that they are prepared to present their paper at the conference. Papers must be written and presented in English. Papers should not exceed 10 A4 pages in length.



Conference proceedings will be published as the third issue of Computer Graphics Forum, volume 21, both on paper and electronically, and will be available to all the conference participants.

The Guenther Enderle Award:

An international jury will select the three best papers accepted and presented at the conference. The best of the three will receive the Guenther Enderle Award, including a cash prize of 1,000 CHF.

Best Student Paper Award:

An award will be given to the best paper authored and presented at the conference by a full time student.



State-of- the-Art Reports

Proposals for STARs are invited by February 4, 2002. State of the Art Reports (STARs) covering topics in research, practice, and applications, will be included in the conference programme. STARs are typically of 90 minutes duration and will be printed in a separate volume given to all conference participants.

Tutorials

Proposals accepted as short presentations will be printed in a separate volume, available to all conference participants.

Industrial Seminars

Industrial seminars will take place to present industrially led computer graphics research projects and applications. Key industrialists from sectors such as aerospace, automotive, and games industry will be sharing their experience in applying computer graphics to solve industrial problems.

VENUE
